
3. Analysis of Feedback:

1. Infrastructure of the college.


(a) Excellent (70%) (b) Average (25%) (c) Satisfied (5%) (d) Unsatisfied (0%)

2. Transparency in conducting examination and declaration of results.


(a)Excellent (75%) (b) Average (15%) (c) Satisfied (10%) (d) Unsatisfied (o)


3. Quality of Teaching-Learning Resources

4. Counseling before examination




(a) Excellent (50%) (b) Average (30%) (c) Satisfied (20%) (d) Unsatisfied (0%)


5. Sufficient time given for any queries or clarifications

6. Teaching in this college.



7. Course /curriculum


(a) Excellent (70) (b) Average (10) (c) Satisfied (20) (d) Unsatisfied (0)

8. Teaching aids



9. Innovative teaching


(a) Excellent (74) (b) Average (16) (c) Satisfied (10) (d) Unsatisfied (0)
